We are supposed to be on fire, or we will face the fires,” Friel says. “These days people think that Jesus needs to be changed and tweaked and made really current and contemporary and the reality is He is current and He is contemporary. He is timeless, and we simply want to show people that.”

Todd’s story is an interesting one. He studied to be a pastor for four years but was missing one extremely important ingredient—he wasn’t a Christian! After abandoning his ministry plans for a while, Todd began working in TV and radio. He was even a stand-up comedian for six years. Todd is currently the co-host of “Way of the Master Radio” with Kirk Cameron and Ray Comfort. Todd also created a DVD and study guide called “Herman Who?” that introduces viewers to Hermeneutics, the study and interpretation of the Bible.
